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There is one humorous experience I can share with the Cornwall Historical Society about Dr. Walker; however, when I talked to my brother about it, he and I remember slightly different accounts:

In 1966 my brother Parker and I had medical exam forms which had to be completed when applying to a college program. They were the same forms and we went to see Dr. Walker for the exams. After explaining our purpose he lead us both into his office, took the forms and laid them side by side in front of him on the desk. He barely looked at us, while I watched his cigarette dangling from his mouth with the ash ready to fall, and he perused the paper work. Dr. Walker abruptly asked, more like a statement rather than a question, "Height" to which each of us responded with what was surely our tallest measurement. "Weight" and when we gave him our answers he jotted them down too. When he asked about our eyesight and we replied "fine," I later saw that he wrote "20-20" in the space provided. Then, he actually took his stethoscope and listened to our hearts and lungs making sure we were fit and filled in the appropriate findings with few idle comments. Looking further down the form and without looking up he gruffly asked, "How was your last period?" I was so dumbfounded and not being one for quick replies, I don't really remember answering at all, but heard my brother Parker say, "Fine, err Fine," which is funny because my brother remembers me saying that!

Well, oddly enough, we both got into college!
