He liked gadgets and had the first battery wall clock in town.

Dr. Martin, a NY City surgeon who had an Italian wife, lived in "The Castle." Luigi was his caretaker and drove Dr. Martin and his family to NYC. Luigi shot himself in the mouth. Dr. Walker was the medical examiner; when he saw Luigi's body, he said, "Why did you do this to me."

He was a "hell of a good doctor" – though he could be grumpy. Dr. Grandlenard (sp?) was the doctor before Dr. Walker and lived in "cottage row" where Brian Kavanaugh now lives. He sent his patients to Pittsfield on the train.

Dr. Walker's wife Katie was very interested in village improvement. She answered the telephone for Brad, "not always so sweetly."

Brad's secretary's "didn't stay too long."

Dr. Walker always drove a Nash – with a reclining front passenger seat. One day he took the car to Vedel Mogenson, the mechanic for Mr. Cartwright, because it was making a funny noise. Vedel drove it and said he couldn't get it to make a noise. "How fast did you drive it?" asked Brad. "Up to 80 MPH and there was no noise," replied Vedel. Charlie Osuch ran a chain saw up his leg – there was no ambulance, so they put a handkerchief on the wound, and WBW drove him to the hospital.

Harry Root got drunk one night; John Horner came the next morning and invited him to go hunting. Before they left, Harry threw a can of gasoline on the wood stove instead of kerosene. John threw him into the brook and WBW drove him to the hospital; he later went to the burn center.
